Lighting of the Advent Candles

Leader: We light the first candle and remember those we have loved and lost. We pause to recall their names, their faces, their voices. We give thanks to God for them, and for His love that binds us to them in life and death.

People: May God's presence surround us with eternal love. (Lighting of the first candle)

Leader: We light the second candle and name our losses: the loss of relationships, the loss of employment, the loss of health. We gather up the pain of the past and offer it to God, asking for the gift of peace from His hands.

People: May God's presence restore, refresh, and renew us. (Lighting of the second candle)

Leader: We light the third candle and recognize ourselves in this season. We pause and recall: the disbelief, the anger, the emptiness, the sadness...family, friends, and all who have stood with us in support.

People: May God's presence show us that dawn defeats night, and that light shines in the darkness. (Lighting of the third candle)

Leader: We light the fourth candle and call to mind God's promises which nurture our faith and kindle our hope. We affirm that, in Jesus Christ, God shares our life, experiences our pain and suffering, and leads us into new life.

People: May God reveal Christ to us as the Way, the Truth, and the Life. (Lighting of the fourth candle)
